# *About the Survey*

---

- Total N=3,000 (+/-1.8%) Los Angeles Residents
  - Antelope Valley, Long Beach, San Fernando Valley, San Gabriel Valley, SELA, South LA
- San Fernando Valley
  - Random Sample N=500 (+/-4.4%)
    - Residents of SFV randomly selected so that each member has an equal chance of being chosen
  - Community Sourced N= 160
    - Participants selected by accessibility and represent the network of community-connected residents of SFV
- Focus is on pandemic recovery

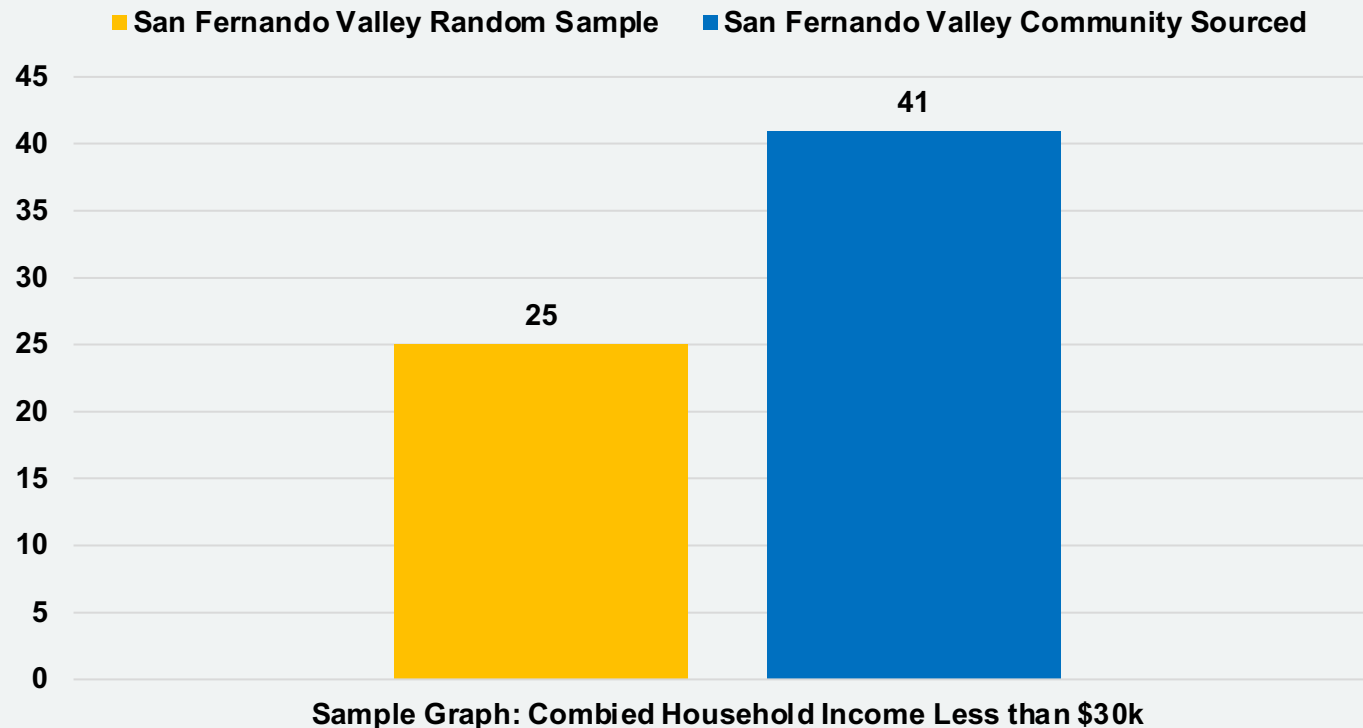

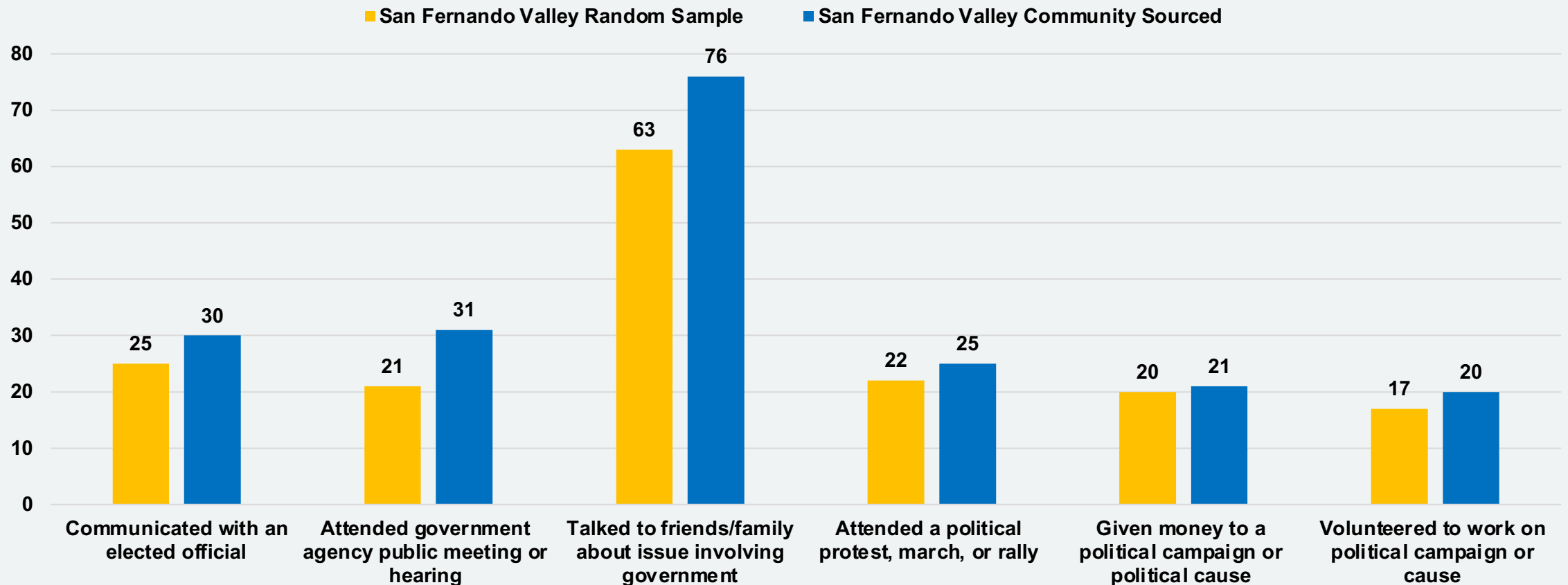

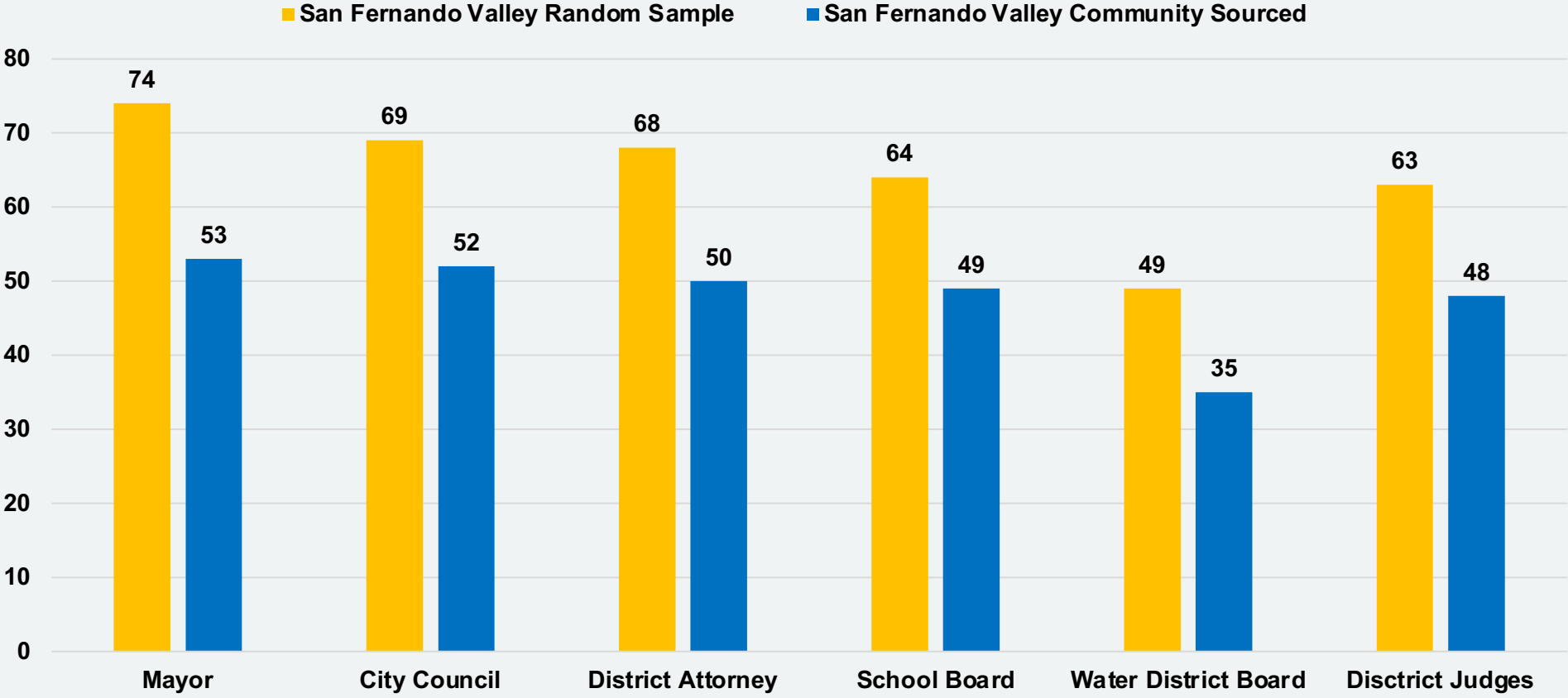

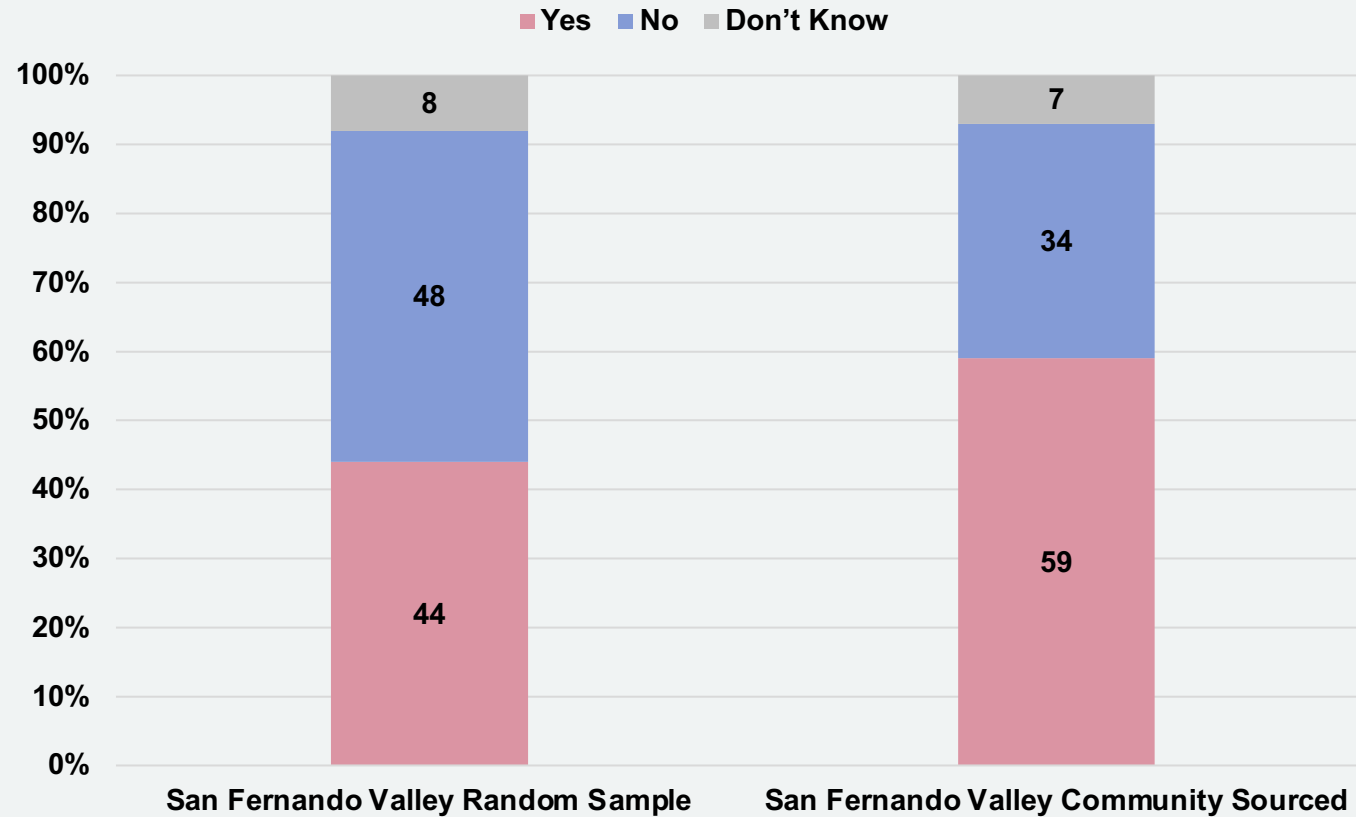
# *SFV respondents were extremely likely to talk with friends/family about an issue involving government during the pandemic*



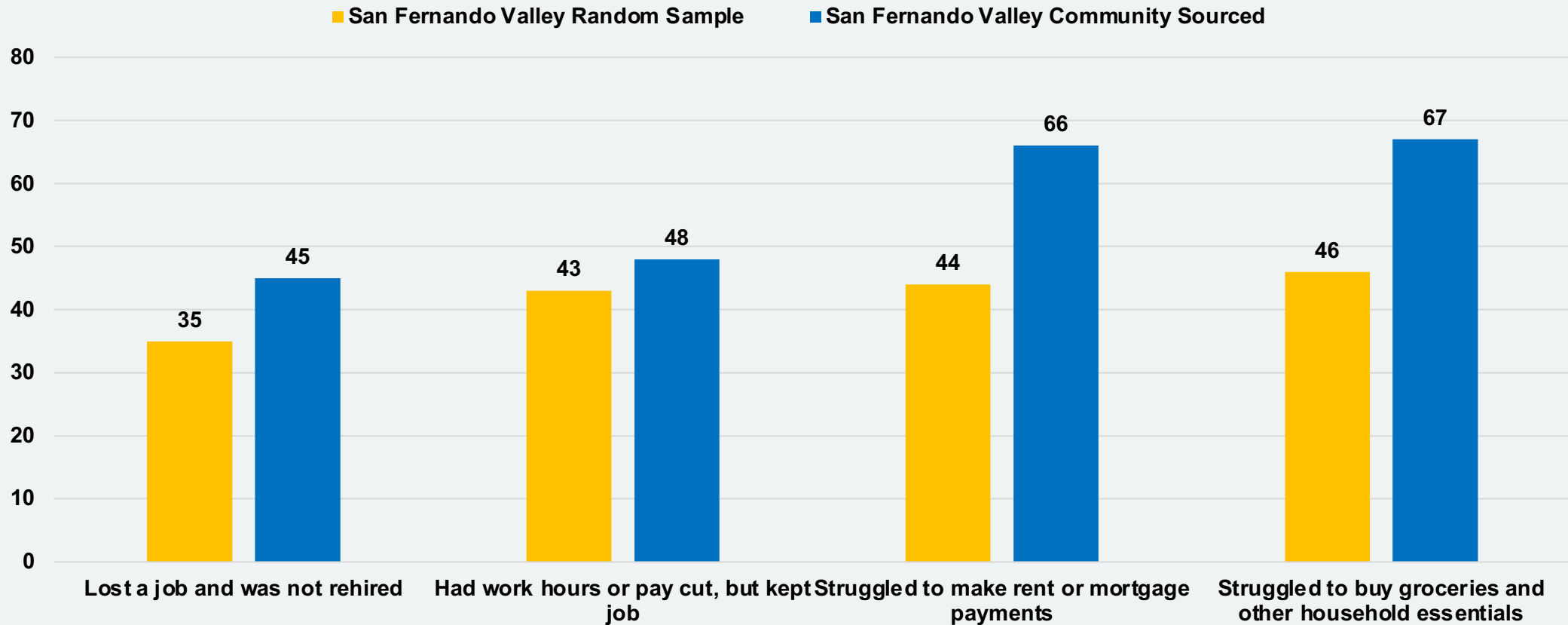
# *Majorities of SFV respondents reported voting for several local public offices*



# *Voter engagement efforts reached fewer than half of SFV respondents in the 2022 election cycle*

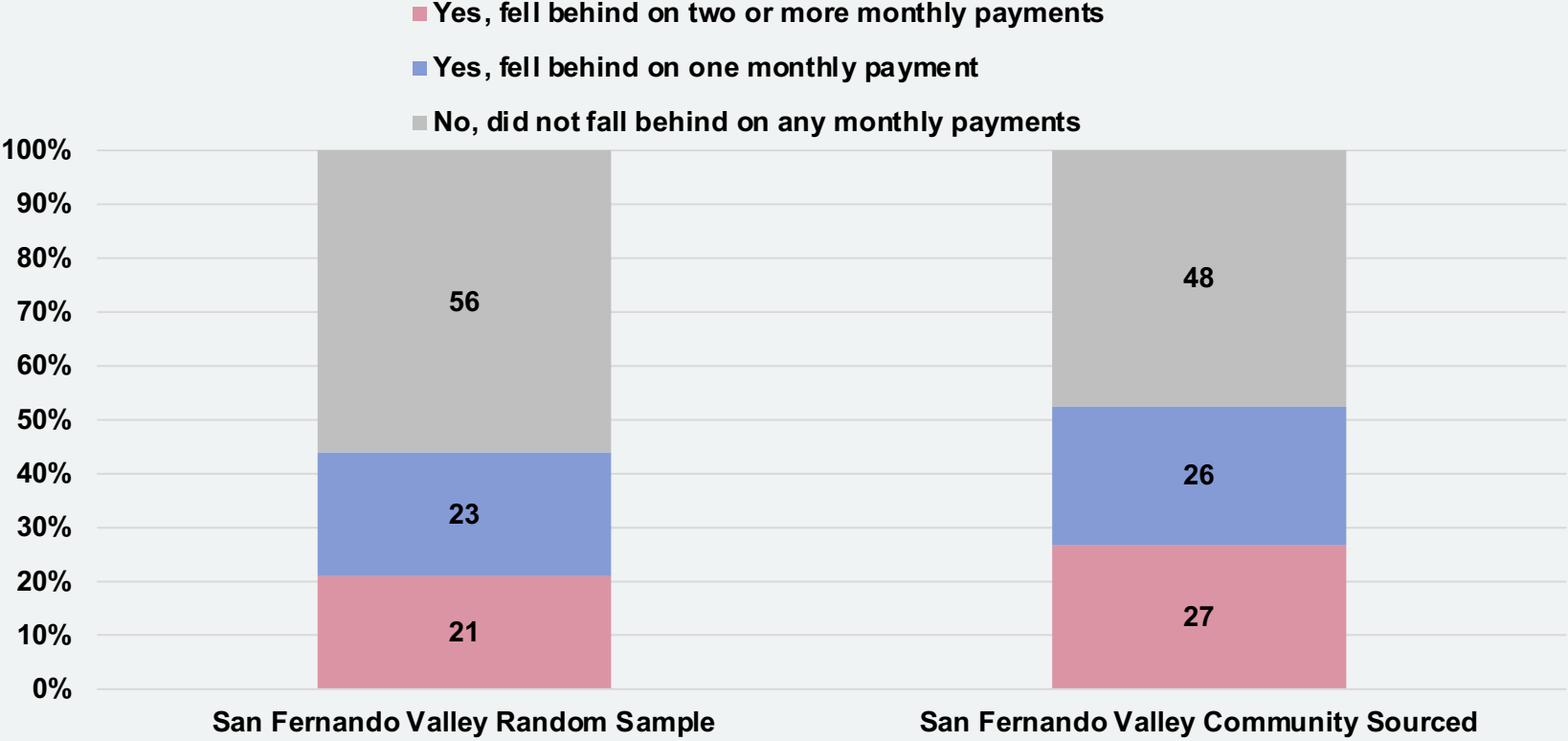


# *Close to half struggled with employment and struggled to make grocery and rent/mortgage payments during the pandemic*

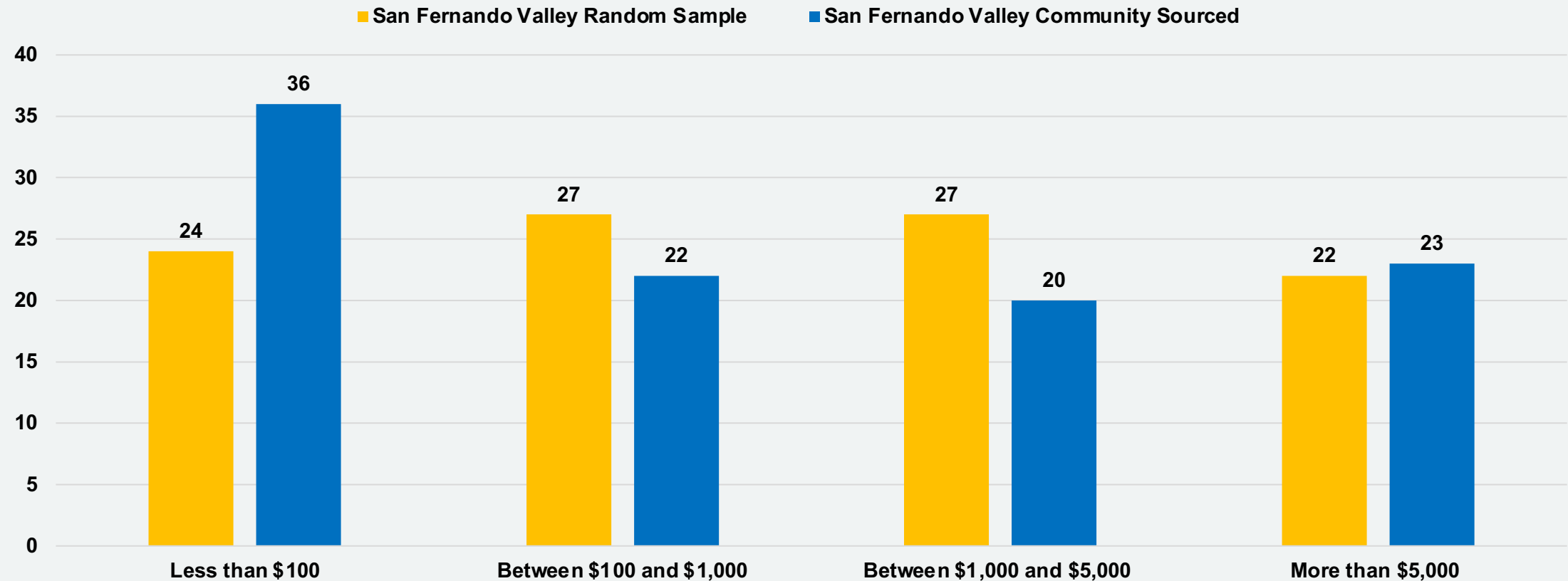




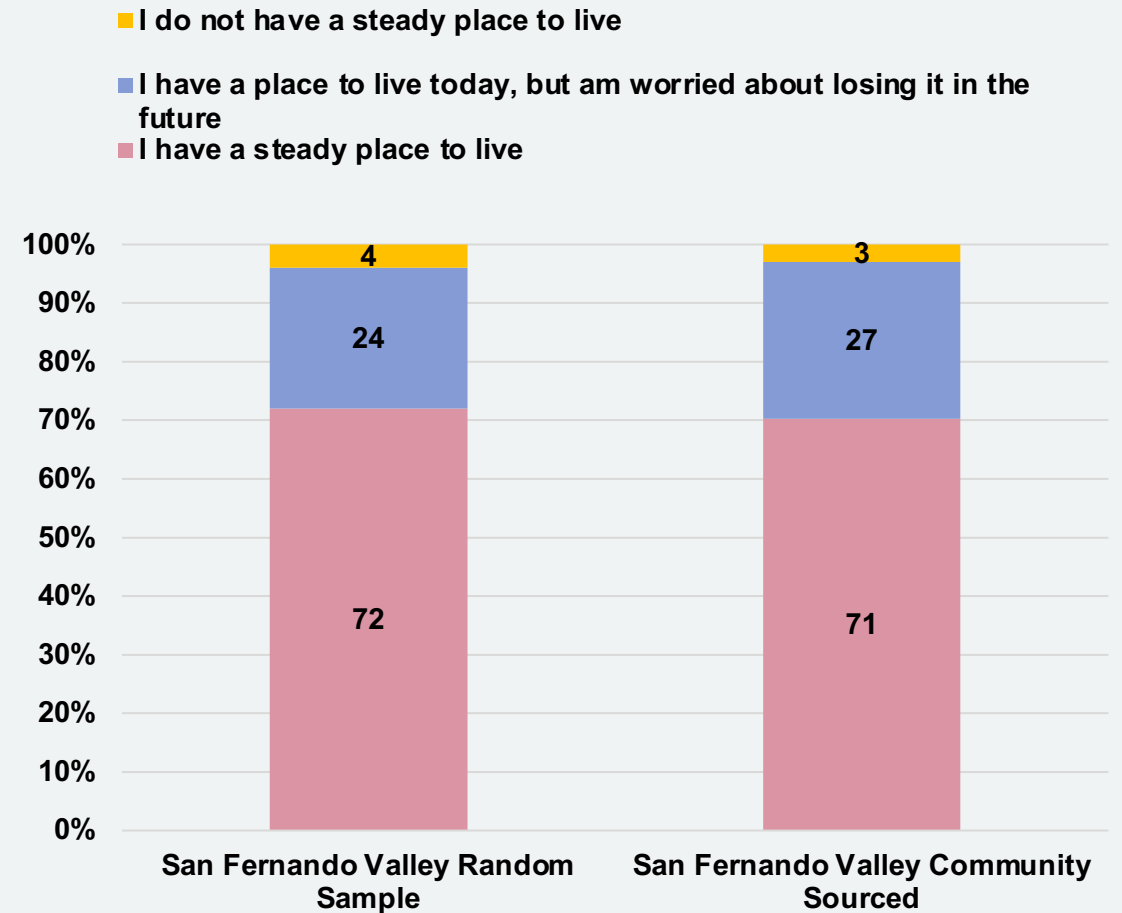
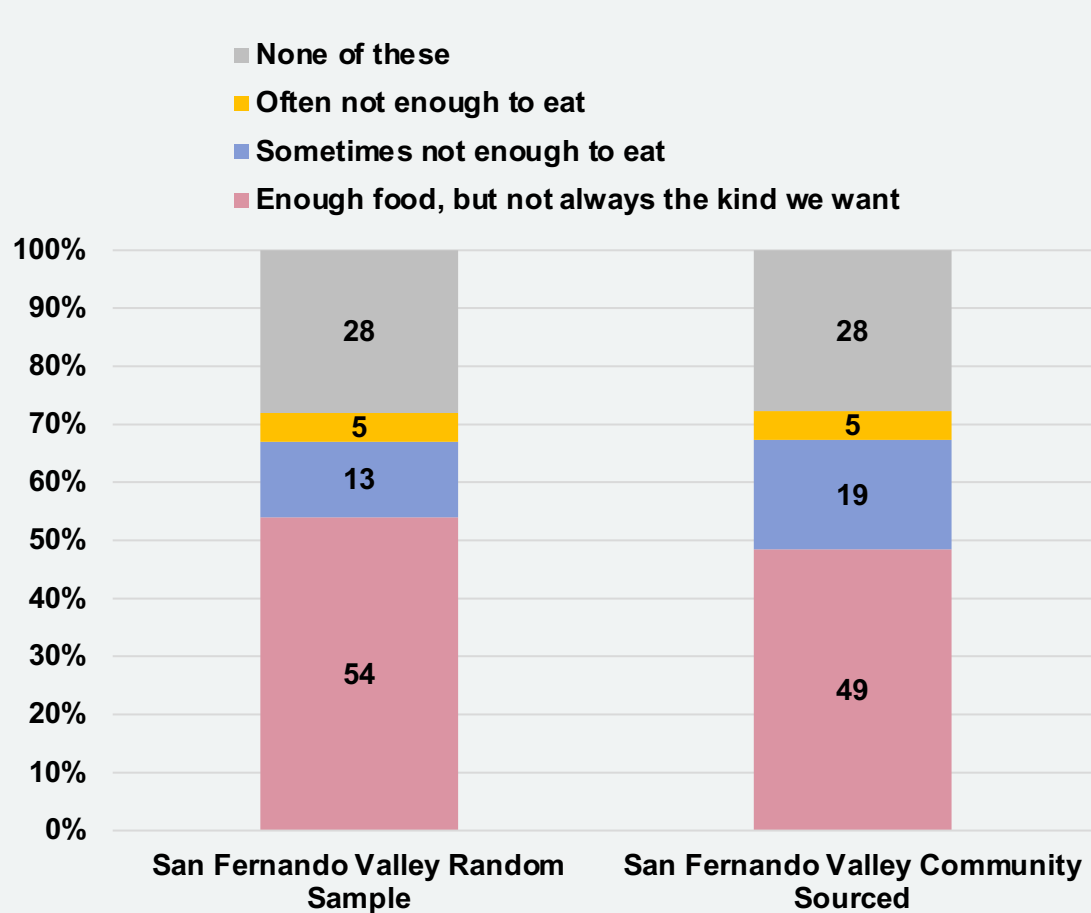
# *Close to half of SFV respondents fell behind at least 1 monthly payment (rent, mortgage, car, utility, etc.) since the pandemic began*



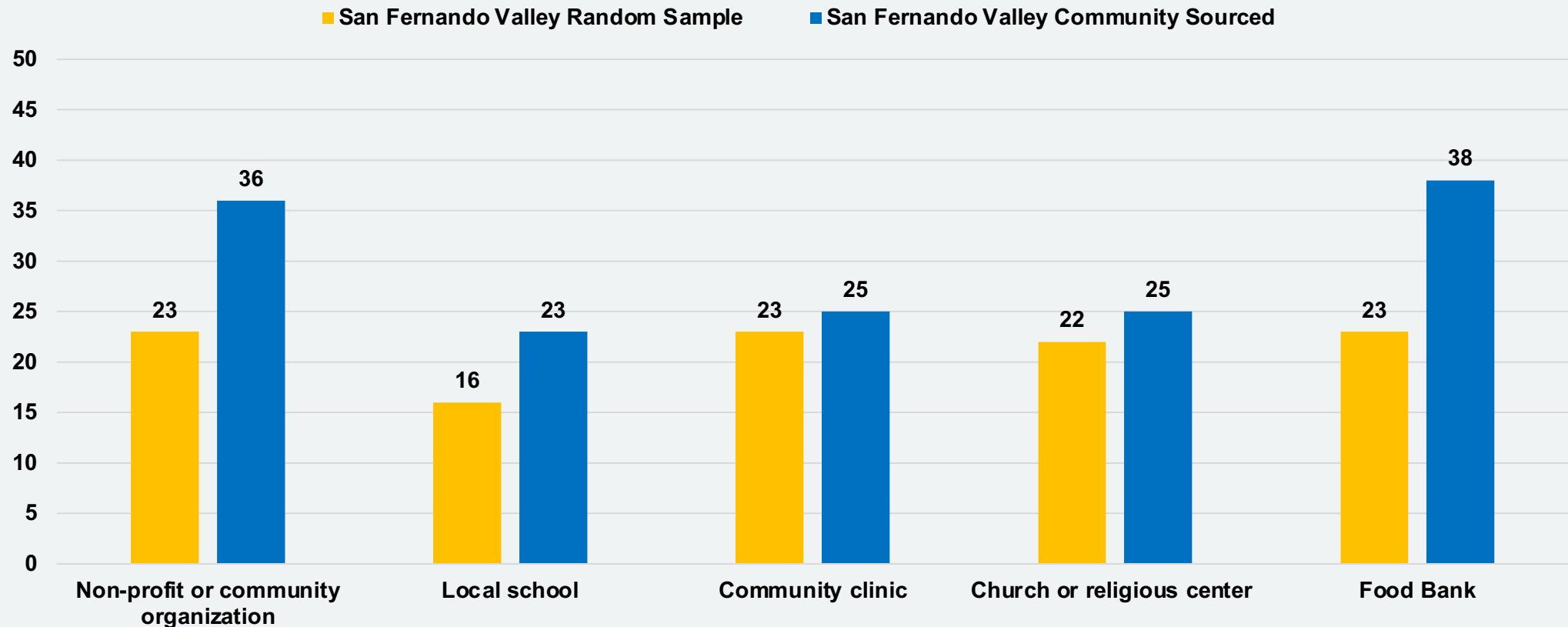
# *An alarming amount reported having less than \$100 saved for emergencies*



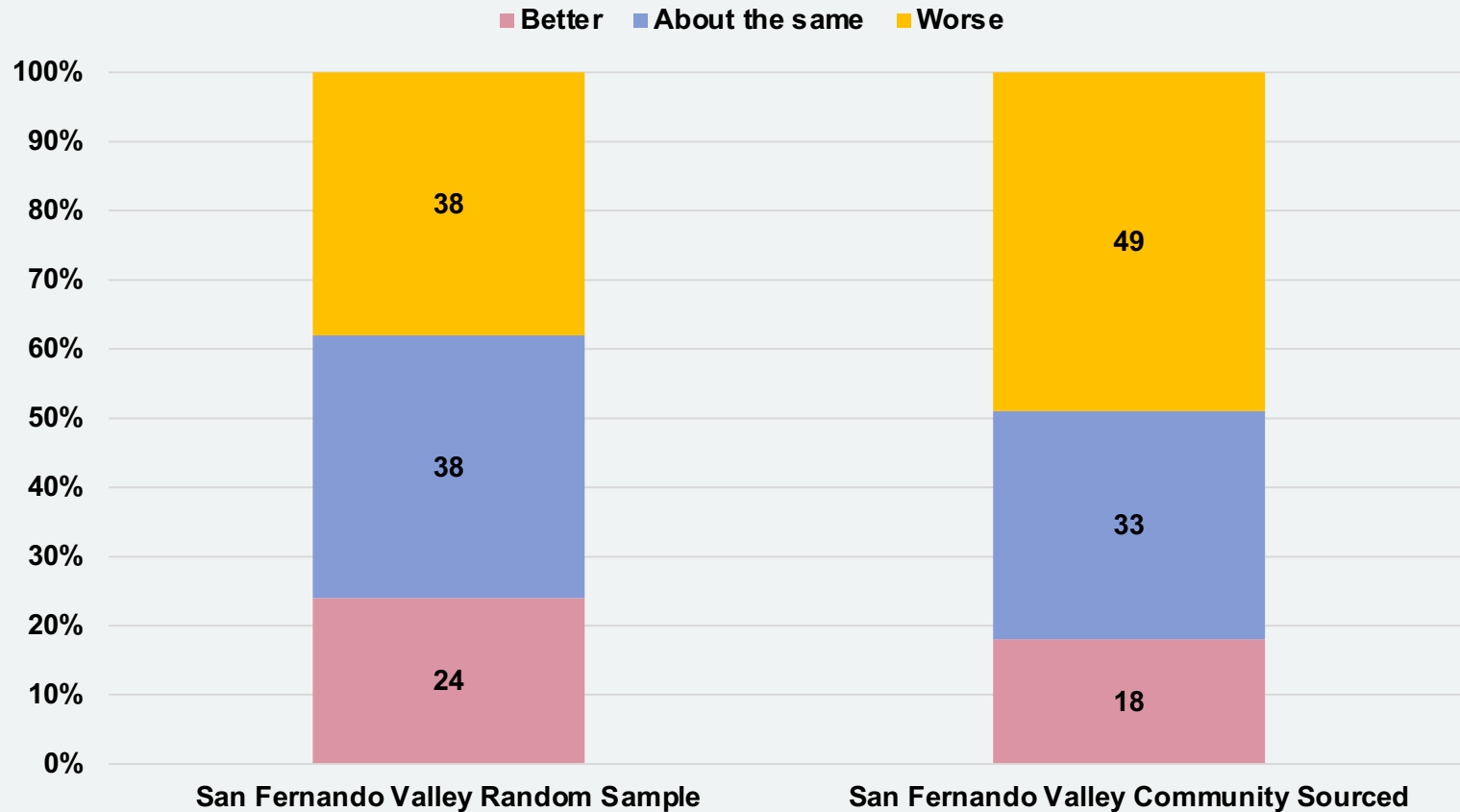
# About 2 in 10 face food insecurity and about 3 in 10 face housing insecurity



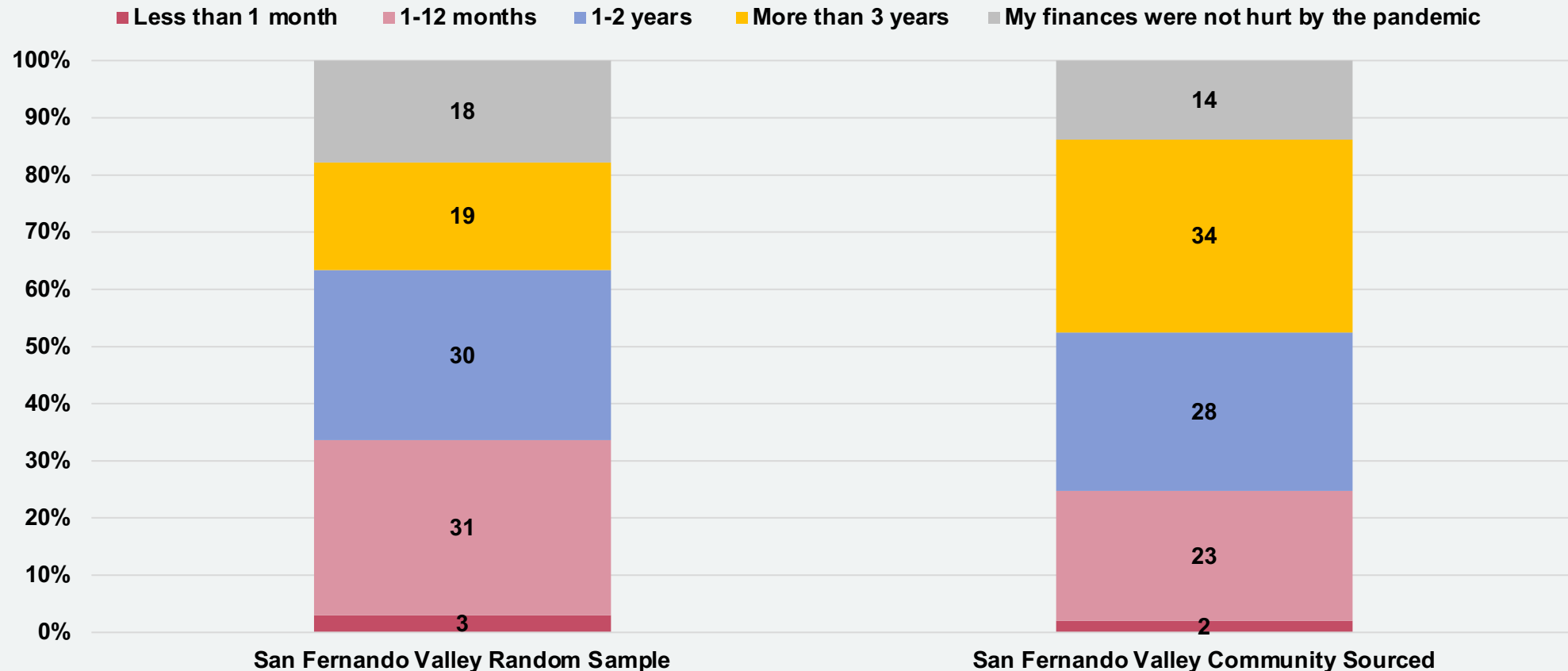
# *About 1 in 4 have relied on several organizations for access to essential needs*



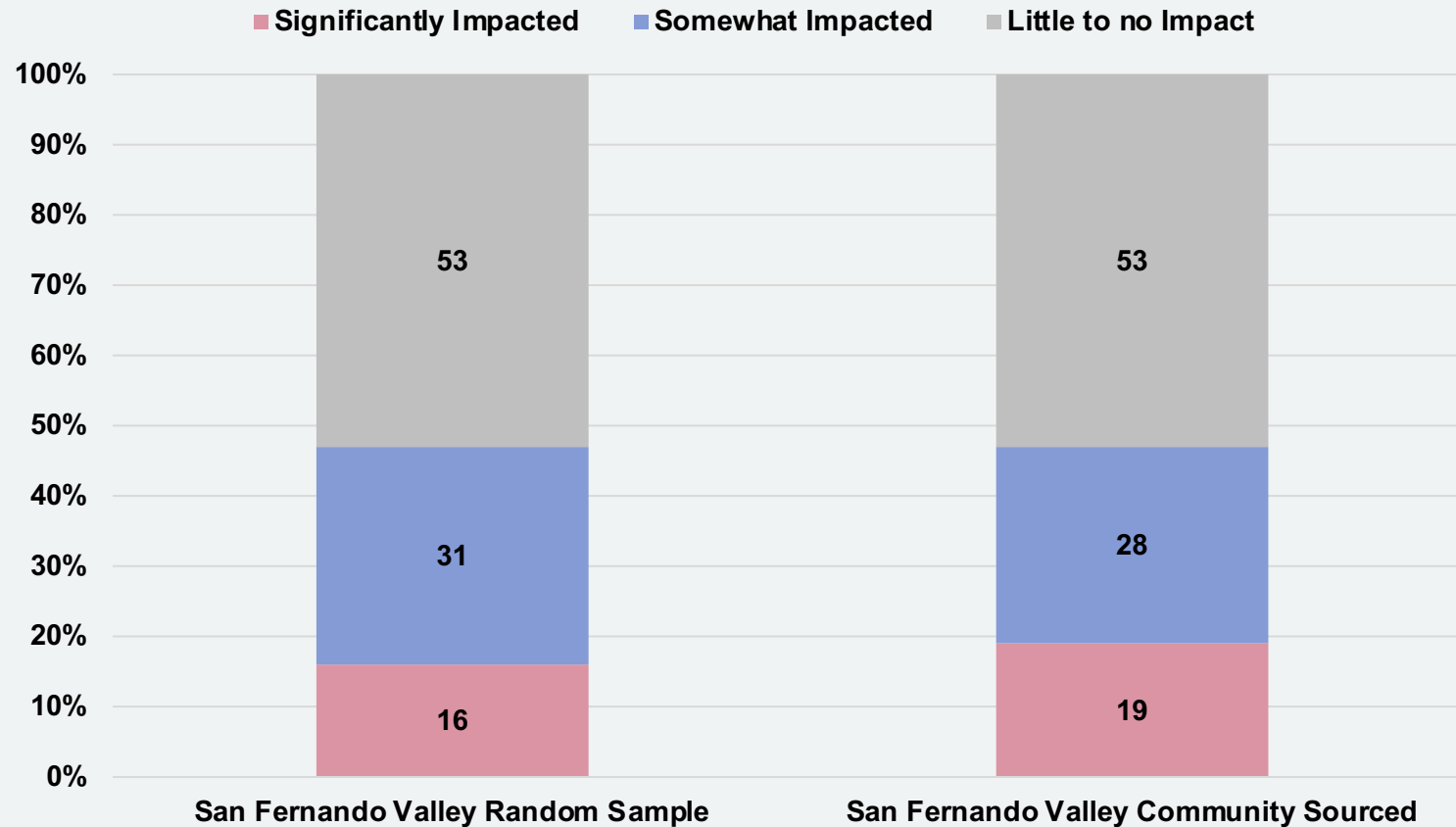
# *The financial situation of over a third of SFV respondents worsened since the pandemic began*



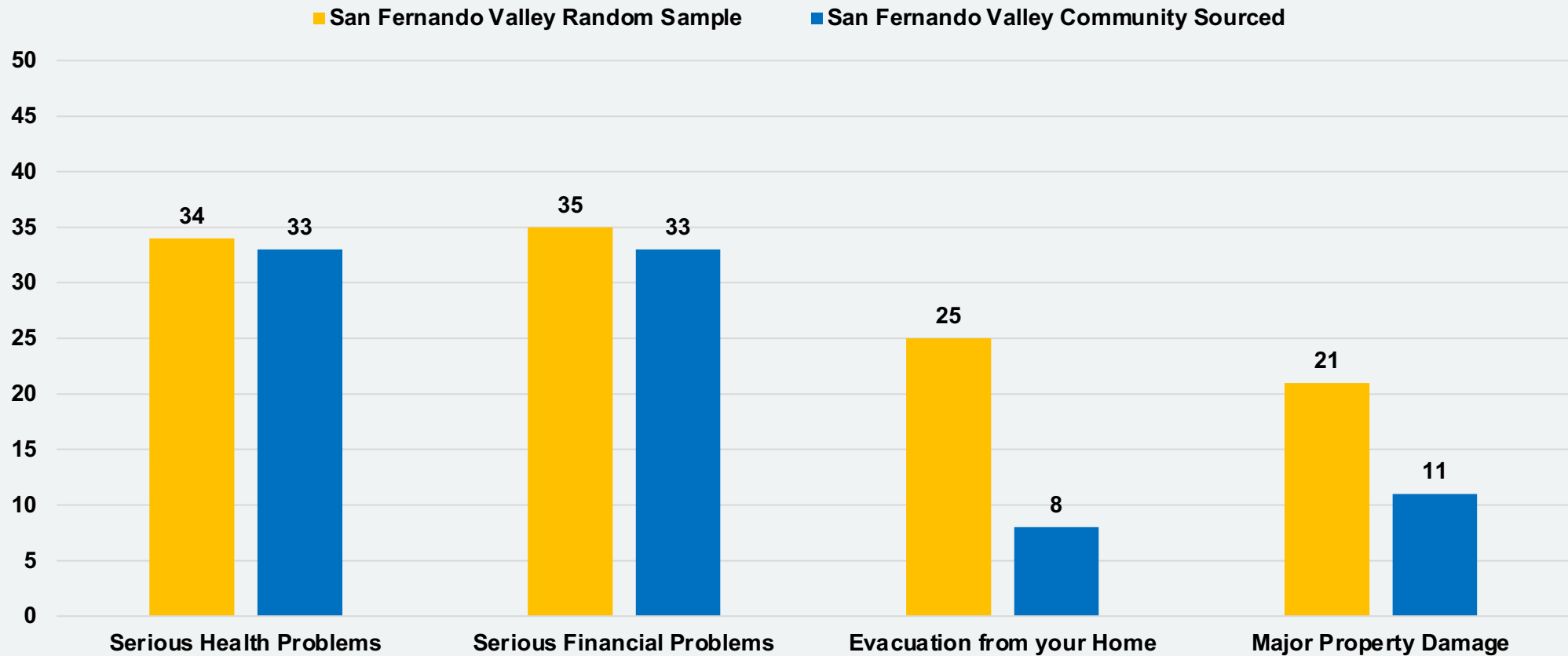
# *1 in 5 respondents believe it will take them more than 3 years to recover economically*



# *About half reported having been affected by extreme weather (heat, wildfires, drought, etc.)*

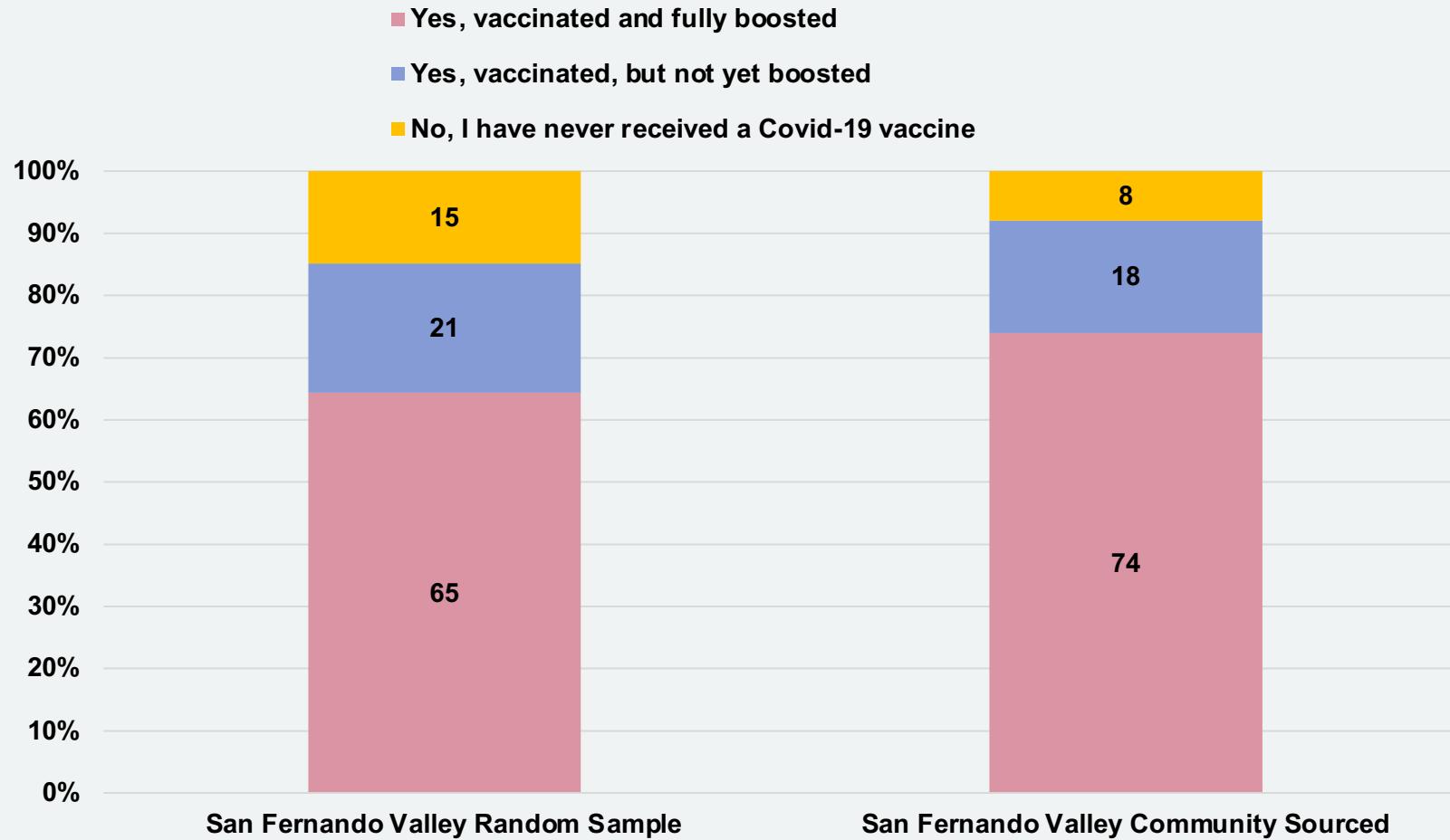


# *About a third reported suffering serious health and financial problems due to extreme weather*

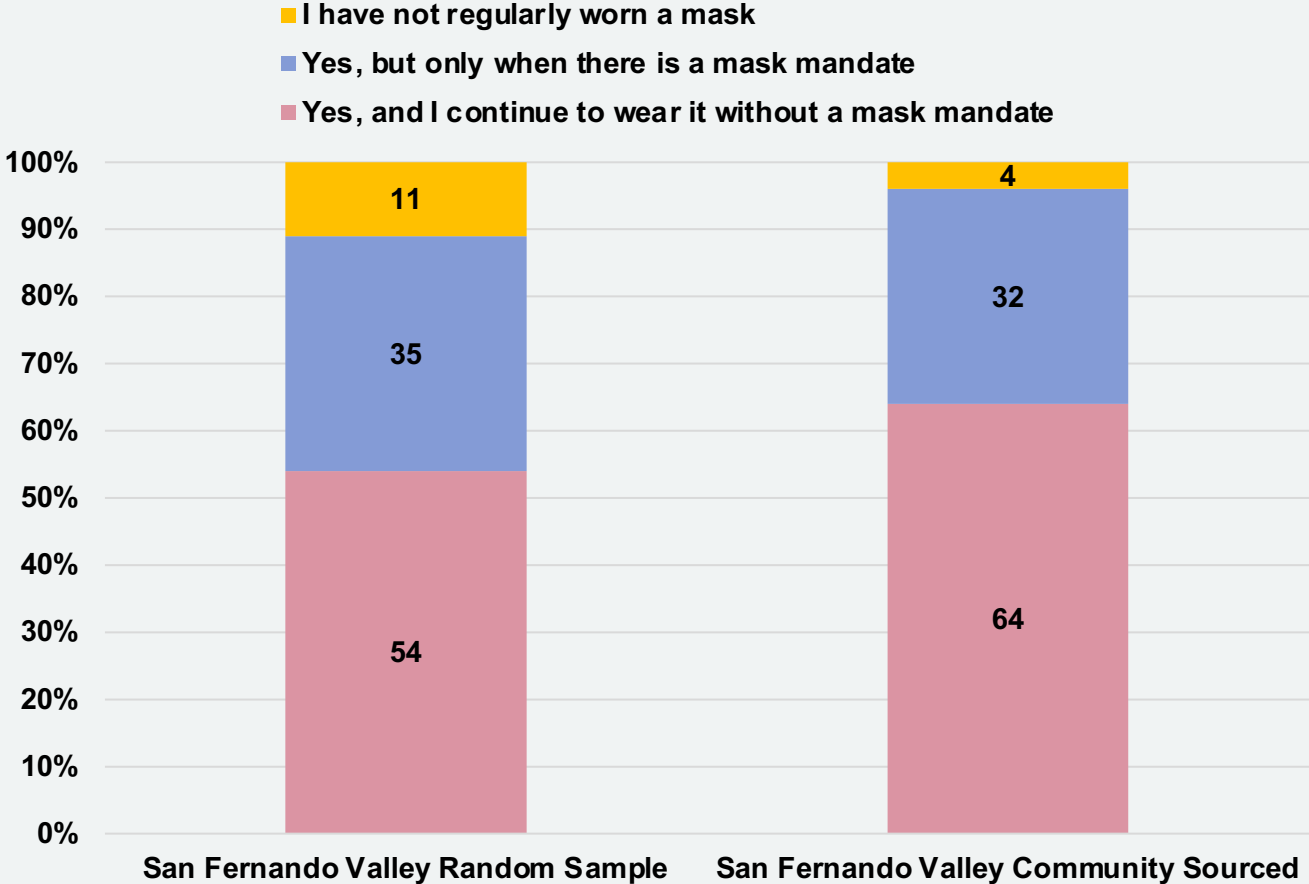




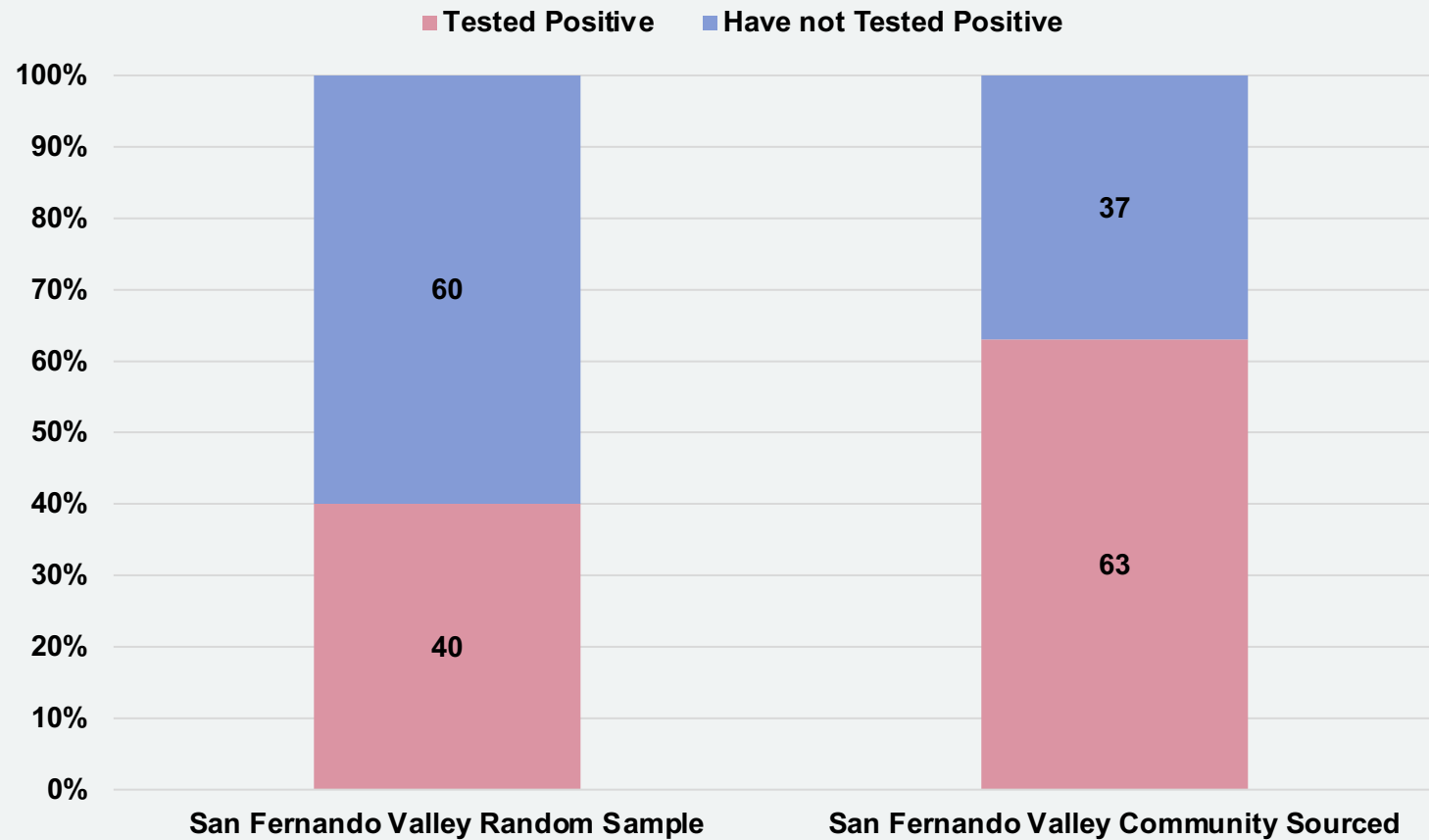
# *Vast majority have received at least 2 COVID vaccines*



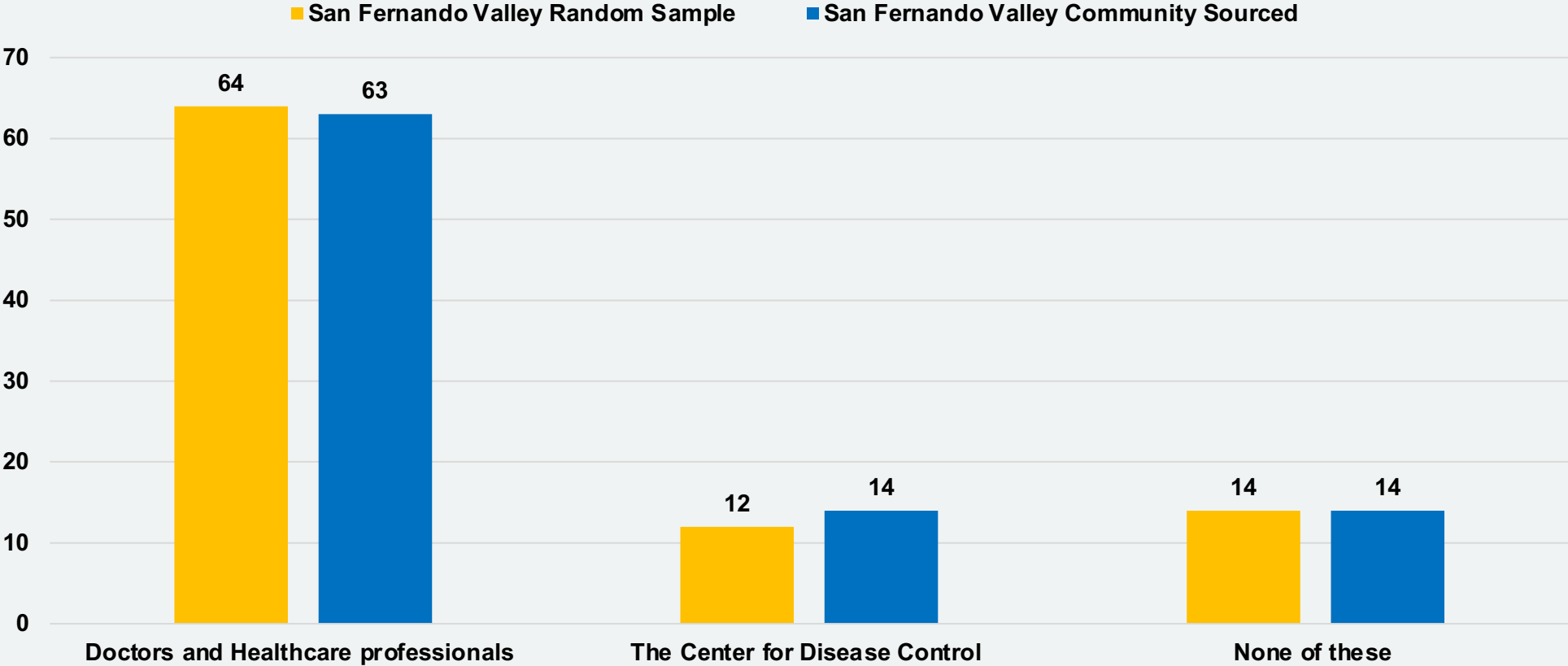
# Majority reports regularly wearing their mask



# *4 in 10 reported testing positive for COVID*

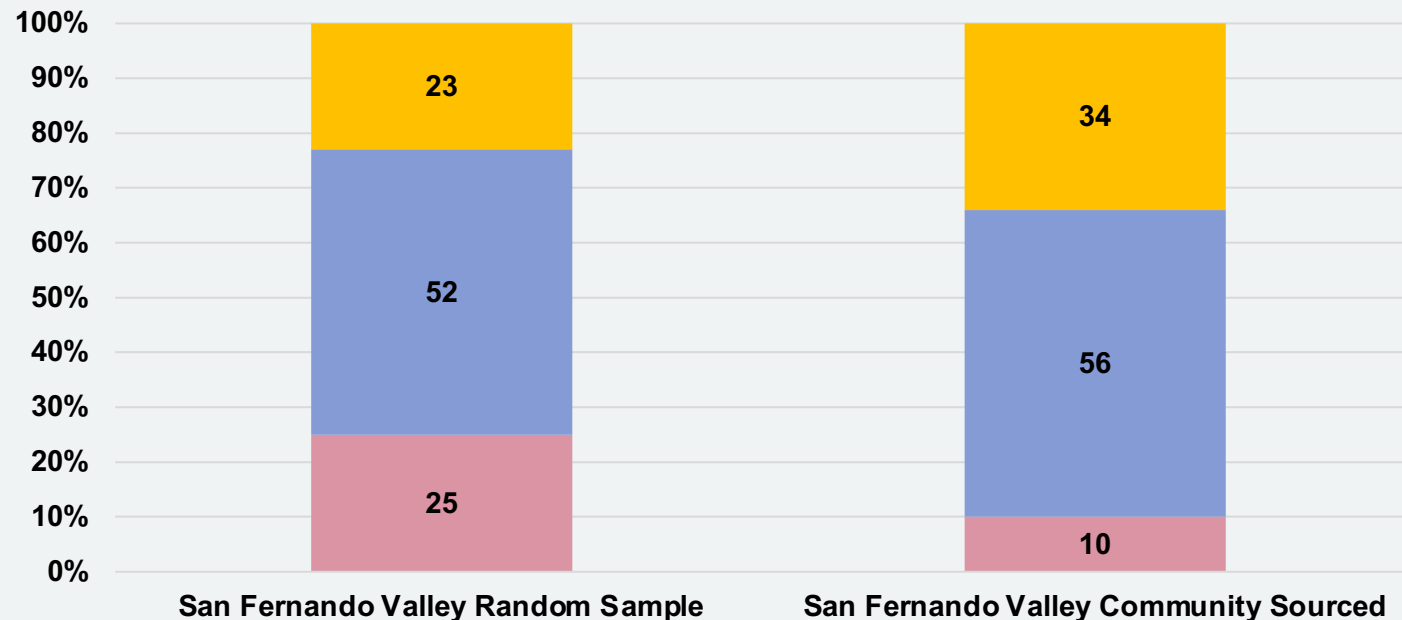


# *Doctors and healthcare professionals are the most trusted messengers for COVID guidance and recommendations*

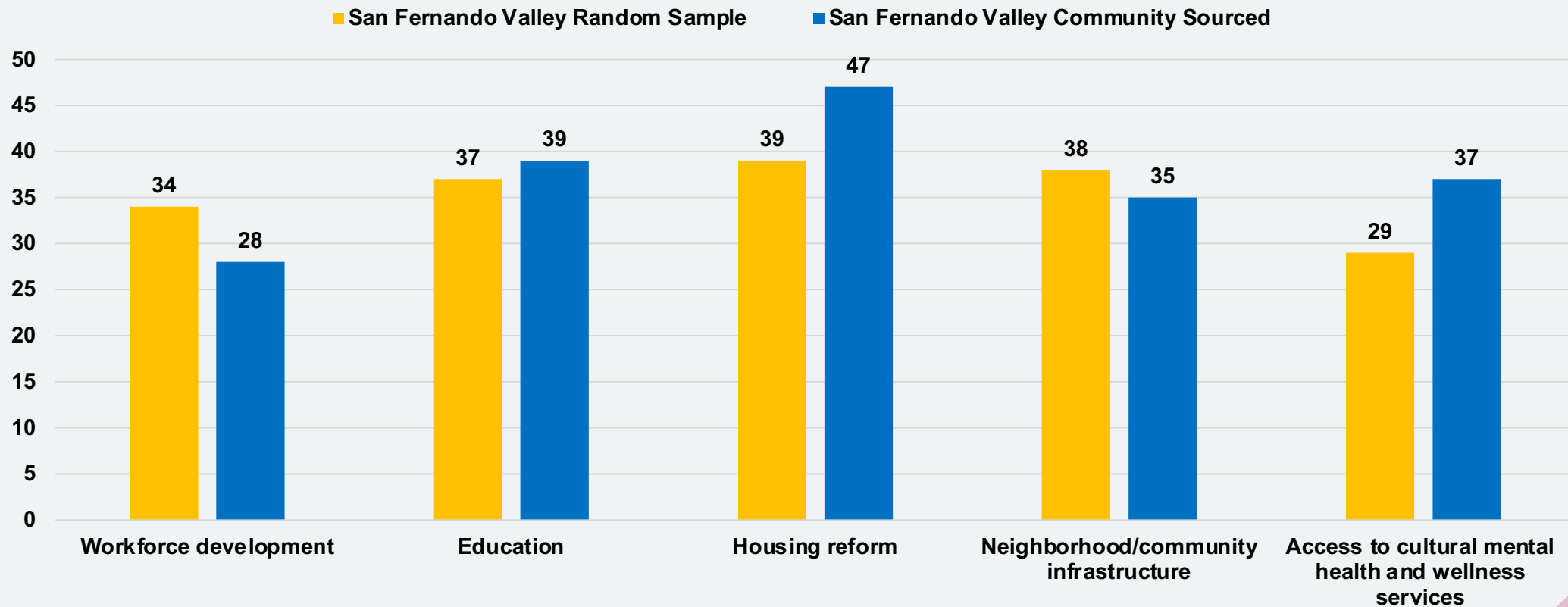


# *Majority believes the worst of the pandemic is over but there is a need to address the issues it created*
